

Candidate for Mecklenburg County Commission at Large – Trevor Fuller

TREVOR M. FULLER is a 50 year-old Democrat that has served on the Mecklenburg County Commission since 2012. He served on the Charlotte Mecklenburg Economic Opportunity Task Force and advanced universal pre-kindergarten initiatives.

ON SCHOOL CHOICE:

Fuller supports the Charlotte Mecklenburg School Choice plans, charter schools and magnet schools.

ON MEASURES TO INCREASE SCHOOL SAFETY:

Fuller believes Charlotte Mecklenburg Public Schools officials are in the best position to make recommendations.

ON MEASURES TO ADDRESS STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES:

Fuller believes additional counselors and social workers are essential.

ON POPULATION GROWTH ISSUES:

Fuller says that uneven growth causes a strain on facilities but that the County is trying to break up high concentrations of poverty.

ON MEASURES TO ADDRESS POPULATION GROWTH ISSUES:

Fuller believes that the school bond proposal recently passed by the Mecklenburg Board of Commissioners will help alleviate the problem.

ON PANTHER STADIUM FUNDING:

Fuller believes that it is important to keep the Panthers in Charlotte but has not committed to using County funds to build a new stadium.

ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING:

Fuller believes the County should partner with the City to solve the problem.

ON 287(G)

Fuller believes the county should discontinue its cooperation with Federal immigration and Customs Enforcement agents.

ON OTHER ISSUES:

Fuller believes the County needs to develop an action plan to address the lack of economic mobility.

Mr. Trevor Fuller is 50 years old and is a Democrat running for the BOCC at Large.

Background civic engagement: Has been a County Comm. At Large since 2012

Qualifications: Is privileged to have represented the more than 1 million people of Meck. County. Has advanced major initiatives to include the Char/Meck Economic Opportunity Task Force and Universal Pre-K which have enabled Meck County residents of every background to

claim their part of the American Dream through self-sufficiency, self-realization and economic security. He has served with vision, ability, honor and dignity.

On school choice: Supports Char/Meck school choice plans as well as charter and magnet schools

On measure for school safety: Would like to see recommendation from CMS who he believes is in the best position to address this issue.

On CMS to address mental health issues: Additional counselors and social workers are essential

On population growth problems: Believes it creates uneven growth which causes a strain on facilities and at the same time efforts to try and break up high concentrations of poverty in schools is being dealt with.

On how to address growth problem: Believes school bonds recently passed by the BOC will help alleviate the problem

On funding for stadium: Believes it is important to keep Panthers in Charlotte, not prepared to commit to how that would be done

On measures for affordable housing: Need to expand partnership with the City to solve this problem

On 287(g): Is in favor of discontinuing enforcement of 287(g)

Other issues: In light of challenges relating to the lack of economic mobility and in response to the report from the Economic Opportunity Task Force believes an action plan needs to be developed specific to Meck County flowing from the Task Force recommendations to embrace real change, not just cosmetic changes.
